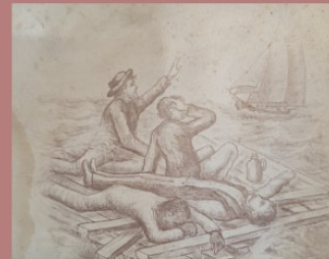

In the Grindle Point Sailors' Museum The *Brig Almira*....

was hauling lumber when it was wrecked by a heavy gale in October 1876. The crew made a raft from the lumber and after surviving six days the two remaining crew, Hobart Dodge, the 18 year-old cook, and Lyonnais Pendleton, mate, were rescued by the fishing *Schooner G.F. Huntress*. Captain Tolman Pendleton and two other crew members perished.

After bringing Hobart and Lyonnais to shore, the *G.F. Huntress* returned to sea and all crew members perished during a storm off Nova Scotia.
