

Islesboro Ferry (Vehicles and passengers)

First boat from Lincolnville to Islesboro is 8:00 A.M.

Last boat from Islesboro to Lincolnville is 4:30 P.M.

On summer schedule the ferry runs most every hour. Fall and winter schedules run fewer trips.

From May into September traffic is high. From June into August traffic can be very high. The limited number of reservations for sale are to be considered. Around July 4th the boat is at the busiest of the year.

There are size and weight limits.

Passengers park at the ferry landing in Lincolnville or Islesboro and walk on. In the summer there are parking restrictions and fees.

Private Boats

If you have your own boat you can use public floats on Islesboro at Grindle Point and Mosley's Landing. Grindle Point is the ferry landing. Mosley's Landing is near the middle of the island by Big Tree Beach. There are restrictions about tying up on the public floats. There are no public moorings but it might be possible to rent or borrow a private mooring. Speak with the Harbor Master for more information.

Grindle Point

Using Grindle Point can be convenient because the ferry and the Quicksilver water taxi run from here giving greater options for transport. However, this is a congested area which can make vehicle parking difficult at times. This is the closest landing to Lincolnville.

Mosley's Landing

Using Mosley's Landing can be convenient because it is less congested than Grindle Point. Parking is less of a challenge. This is the closest landing to the northern staging area at the Transfer Station. Coming from Belfast this landing is closer than Grindle Point.

Lincolnville

Islesboro has no particular sway regarding usage of this harbor. This is a congested area. Parking is available at the ferry landing in Lincolnville.

Seal Island

The caretaker will provide transportation between Seal and Islesboro. Typically he lands at Mosley's Landing.

The caretaker will want to accompany you when on the island.

There is an ATV on the island which may be used to move light equipment.

Transfer Station – waste removal

You can leave cardboard and wood spools at the Transfer Station for no fee. Other debris goes in dumpsters. The Town has dumpsters which you can use or you can rent dumpsters for your sole usage.

If using the Town dumpsters, you pay by the load. Loads are estimated by the attendant. Typically it is around \$25 per pickup-truck load. Call the Transfer Station for more information.

The Transfer Station is open Sunday, Monday, and Wednesday 8:30 to 4:30.

For dumpster rentals, the Town uses Pinetree services. The Town rates are as follows:

4 Yards, emptied once a week = \$415.00 per Month

10 Yards, emptied once a week = \$725.00 per Month

There is also a delivery fee for a temp can of \$150, and a removal fee of \$150, plus the ferry cost.
